## Resignation Letter

October 19, 2020

To the Presbytery of North Central Iowa and Marshalltown 1st Presbyterian Church

As most of you are aware, I experienced a stroke on July 7. Several strokes have occurred since that time. I am currently working with numerous therapies at On with Life in Ankeny to regain my strength.

The process is taking quite some time. Due to this, it is with a heavy heart that I have decided to resign my position as Senior Pastor at the First Presbyterian Church of Marshalltown as of November 1, 2020.

We move forward as a church family carefully and prayerfully. We all will need to respect others' personal decisions about re-entering the church.

## A Meaningful Month





This past Sunday, I shared the thought: The Church is called to **BE** His plan, not to **SEE** His plan. What did I mean by that? I am not saying we shouldn't seek wisdom and

understanding. I am not saying it is irrelevant to know God's plans. I'm saying we can't! Ephesians 3:20 says God "is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to His power that is at work within us." It is His power and work in us, not our own. We simply need to BE the people of God. And for that, we don't need to SEE the big picture. We can't, and that's ok.

My friend, former student, and son of our church, Adam Podhajsky shared these sentiments on how 2020 has been for him:

*"While 2020 has been a year full of heartbreak, pain, and frustration for many, it has also been a year rich with God's faithfulness as I look back at my own life and the lives of some around me. Being able to get married back in May to my best friend, with all of our close family present, despite having COVID-19 throw a wrench in the plans, was such a huge blessing and answer to prayers. Then when I got laid off from work, it became a blessing in disguise as I got the extra time at home to spend with my new wife. When I eventually started a new job, I was blown away with gratitude towards God once again as it was a much better job than the one I was previously laid off from!"*

*While it's easy for us to sometimes get caught up in the negative things going on around us in this world, God's promise to us, "to never leave us nor forsake us", always holds true. His goodness and faithfulness never cease. He never stops working for us, and never loses ability to bring good things out of bad situations."*

God is faithful despite the circumstances or context of our lives. Scripture tells us many things about God's plans! Most importantly that we are His, we are forgiven in Christ, and we are to be imitators of Christ. All we need to SEE, is who we are meant to BE. Even though so many things are uncertain in these days, we can still BE the Church, and we will always BE His.

## Words of Wisdom from Rev. Tom Bower

Transition is defined as "the process or a period of changing from one state or condition to another."

It's an understatement to say that we are in a period of transition. The "we" refers to the whole world, for sure, in 2020. But we can say the same thing about our church family. I am being called a "Transitional Pastor" as I serve with you for the next several months. When I discussed my title with Rev. Ian McMullen, our Presbytery Executive, he suggested that we not use the title "Interim Pastor." Interim Pastor suggests that we will be in a holding pattern, no changes, until a new pastor is put in place. But we can't remain in a holding pattern. The Lord is calling us to a new future in our new realities.

Transition, for us, will refer to several things. First, and most important, we are together with Pastor Rich and Val and family in their transition. We stand with them; we will celebrate their ministry with us for these many years. We love on them! They are, and will remain, part of our church family.

Second, when we are able to be back together in our church building, we will, re-connect with one another. In that re-connection we will be renewed in our commitment to one another, to our ministry and to Jesus Christ Himself. It's not that we have left those commitments during the pandemic, but it will be a joy to renew and revitalize.

Third, we will spend these months reviewing "where we are" in our ministry plans - Christian education, worship style, member visitation, community outreach, staffing and budgeting. We will articulate in simple terms where we believe God wants us to go and what God wants us to be.

Remember the song:

"I'll go where you want me to go dear Lord,  
O'er land or mountain or sea.

I'll say what you want me to say, dear Lord,  
I'll be what you want me to be."

## OCTOBER SESSION ACTIONS

The Stated Session meeting of First Presbyterian Church, Marshalltown, met via Zoom, October 20, 2020.

Moderator Rev. Tom Bower opened the Session meeting at 7:02 p.m. with prayer. Heather Rottink presented the devotions and prayer.

There was a quorum in attendance.

**Motion prevailed** to approve the corrected September 15, 2020 Session minutes by adding the words as per 100,000 after 10 and 15 cases in the "Church Reopening" report.

Rev. Ian McMullen, Pastor to the Presbyteries, gave a prayer and then read a letter from Rev. Dr. Richard A. King about his resignation as pastor of Marshalltown First Presbyterian Church effective November 1, 2020. Pastor Rich will still be in good standing at Presbytery but will be removed from the committees he now serves on. **Motion prevailed** to accept Pastor Rich's resignation with heavy hearts. An email will be sent out to church members from Session on Wed., Oct. 21, and Deacons will all be called to contact the people they visit to let them know about the resignation. (See the letter on the front page).

Staff reports were presented.

**Finances:** Matt Broshar presented the financials. September giving was the lowest in the last three years. Expenditures are down but we have a positive fund balance. We received a \$5,000 grant from Presbytery for derecho repairs and we have received the insurance check for damage done to the church.

**Finance/Stewardship:** No finance report. Matt Broshar reported he plans to email the giving statements to most people. He reminded committee chairpersons to get their budgets ready to present at the November Session meeting. Ron Kauffman reported that a Stewardship letter, faith pledge card and a return envelope to send the card to the church will be sent to families and friends of the church the last week of October.

**Mission/Evangelism:** Dave Freel reported the committee has submitted three Presbytery grants at \$1,500 for Wells for Sudan, Jonathan's House lunch program in Central African Republic and MorningStar Missions in Honduras. Matt Broshar represented this church at the Zoom meeting presenting the grants. Dave presented the Missions financial allocations for 2021 with his report. Dave will keep in contact with Valerie King to see where the committee can help with the King family needs.

**Worship & Music:** Wynona Anderson reported noting the committee greatly appreciates the job Pastor Tom and Jon Rottink are doing with the worship services. The outdoor service at Grimes Farm was successful. The committee will send out a survey to gain an understanding of our congregants in relation to

the live stream and where they stand on reopening the church.

**Christian Ed:** No report.

**A & P:** Richie Ritter reported noting that he has been in contact with both Rich & Valerie King and it was their decision to send Rich's letter of resignation to Presbytery. The church needs to continue to care for and support the King's in this transition. **Motion prevailed** to accept Rev. Thomas Bower as the transitional pastor. The A & P Committee is moving forward to work with Presbytery to get a full-time pastor for this church. They have a plan to move forward with Rev. Bower as lead pastor and make sure people know the church is still open.

**Membership & Involvement:** No report.

**Property:** Don Feld reported that the south parking lot has been resurfaced. The church received an insurance check for \$5,578.52 for church damages during the derecho (this was minus the \$2,500 deductible). Aspen Roofing has submitted an estimate for providing snow stops for the metal roof at \$9,462.37. **Motion prevailed** to proceed with putting the snow stops on the church metal roof. The church has received a \$5,000 grant from Presbytery for derecho damage. There should be enough money to cover the costs for derecho damages. **Motion prevailed** to get the four-channel system to project the Sunday services for Fellowship Hall and the nursery area.

**Church Reopening:** Steve Anderson reported showing several slides and graphs on COVID-19 risk levels showing the framework for policy makers and the public regarding reopening the church. The primary consideration is for safety of the congregation and staff. Wearing masks, social distancing, lower infection rates and sanitation will provide better protection. The worship service will probably not be opened for a few weeks. Some people have gone through training to be greeters and ushers when the church does reopen. **Motion prevailed** to support the criteria devised by the reopening committee. **Motion prevailed** to open the church for small groups of 12 or less to meet in the church who are members or regularly attend this church or persons who want to come to the church to pray in the Sanctuary. All groups or individuals would have to follow the criteria set up by the reopening committee for using the church. People would come to these meetings at their own risk.

**Other:** A Deacon has been named to complete the 2020 Nominations Committee so they can start searching for new Elders and Deacons for the class of 2023.

**Motion prevailed** to adjourn the meeting. The meeting was closed at 9:00 with prayer by Rev. Tom Bower and the group repeated the "Lord's Prayer."
