

The postal carriers in Marshalltown will hold their **2022 food drive** on Saturday, May 14th. You can participate by leaving a small bag of groceries by your mailbox/slot that day. This is the biggest day for donations that the Emergency Food Box receives each year.

There are 55 quilts on display in Fellowship Hall. This represents two sessions worth of work by around ten people working at the church and at home. Many children will be comforted by these quilts.
